Deputy Chief, Shawn Devine, presented the Condensed Monthly Statistical Reports for the month of September 2015 (Revised). One hundred and two calls were to investigate motor vehicle accidents. Ten of these accidents resulted in injuries to 16 persons. He noted that sexual assaults and assaults are down however, calls are up by 10% in the month of September and the average of 80 calls per day was increased to 88 calls per day.

Mobile Crisis Annual Report

An information item on this first year program indicated that approximately six mental health calls per day are managed by the North Bay Police Service. This is a very high number when compared to other areas. The main goals of the program are to provide assistance and support to persons in mental health crisis in the community in a more efficient, effective and compassionate manner and to reduce wait times in the Emergency Department at the Regional Hospital for both those in need of mental health assistance and our officers. A number of recommendations contained in the report are being explored further. The Chief stated that the Police will always be the safety net as cuts to other agencies are being made.



I want to take this opportunity on behalf of the Ottawa Police Service Internet Child Exploitation Unit to express our sincere thanks and appreciation for the support and assistance provided by Detective Constable Jason Long in investigating a serious offence of Child Exploitation.

The efforts made by D/C Long were instrumental in solidifying a conviction for the offences of Luring a Child and the Possession of Child Exploitation Material. The uniqueness of these types of investigations are always fraught with numerous challenges and potential obstacles, but D/C Long provided invaluable resources and fulfilled time constrained requests from myself and the Crown Prosecutor in this matter.

The accused was responsible for the online luring of numerous children across North America as well as Internationally, which culminated in his arrest where he had agreed to meet a mother and her small children at a local hotel for sexual contact. Due to D/C Long's continued support, the accused was sentenced to three (3) years in prison with a life time association to the Canadian Sexual Offenders Registry.


