An out of town meeting, attended by the Chief, was the OPTIC Board meeting, Toronto.

In response to a question from Sheldon Forgette the Deputy Chief shared the fact that cyber crime is increasing across Canada. The area he is involved in deals with how victims are being educated and working with victims by providing tools to support them. The Chief took this opportunity to thank Deputy Chief Tod for his continued efforts on the Cyber Crime Committee.

Statistical Reports

The Deputy-Chief, presented the Condensed Monthly Statistical and Revised Statistical Reports for the month of December 2016 (Revised); to the Board. As reported in previous months, there is an overall increase in 2016 in Police Activity and Calls for Service, and a slight decrease in the number of criminal offences. There were 176 motor vehicle accidents investigated. Twenty of these accidents involved injuries with 29 persons sustaining injuries. There has been an overall reduction in clearance of sexual assaults by 8% from 2015.

NORTH BAY POILICE SERVICES BOARD COMMENDATION

BILL HUMMEL

On the 28th of December, 2016, The North Bay Police Service responded to a report of an intoxicated male on a North Bay Transit vehicle at the downtown terminal. After conducting his investigation and making his observations, Cst. Elia formulated the necessary grounds to make an arrest under the Liquor License Act. When Cst. Elia approached the accused, he became combative and actively resisted the arrest.

The situation quickly escalated as the subject was found to be in possession of a sheathed weapon. During the struggle, Cst. Elia was able to deploy his Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW) on two occasions. The weapon had no affect due the amount of clothing the accused was wearing.

Cst. Elia's efforts to restrain this individual were thwarted at every turn. Backup eventually arrived, but the struggle to arrest this man continued. It was at this point that Bill Hummell decided to assist the officers without any regard for his own safety. Mr. Hummell added the much needed pair of hands to finally restrain this individual. While other passengers on the bus were seemingly paralyzed and stunned by what was happening, Mr. Hummel jumped into a very volatile and dangerous situation with an intoxicated and unpredictable suspect.

Bill Hummell's courageous actions are truly commendable and likely prevented injury to the North Bay police officers who responded to the call as well as preventing further offences from being committed.

Bill Hummell is hereby awarded a North Bay Police Services Board Commendation for his bravery and timely response in coming to the aid officers in lawful execution of their duties.

Vimy Ridge, Part of our Heritage...


One of the greatest battles in Canadian history was the battle at Vimy Ridge, which began on 9 April 1917. Canadian bravery and valour led to the tremendous victory for the entire Allied Force and was considered the turning point of WWVI.

For the first time in World War I, all four Canadian divisions fought on the same battlefield. They were led by Sir Arthur William Currie, who was the first Canadian-appointed commander of the Canadian Corps. Currie determinedly kept the Canadian divisions together rather than having them mixed in with various British units. It was the first time the Canadians fought together, and they achieved a magnificent victory.


Early in the morning of 9 April 1917, 20,000 soldiers attacked in the first wave of fighting. By that afternoon, the two front lines had been taken by the Canadian Corps. By 12 April, the entire ridge was under Allied control. When Hill 145, the highest feature on the ridge, fell, the operation was considered to be a resounding success. The ridge remained in Allied hands for the duration of the war.

The victory of the battle of Vimy Ridge did not come without cost: Canadian casualties reached 10,602, of which 3,598 were killed. The opposing German force sustained a further 20,000 casualties. During this single campaign, four Canadians were awarded the Victoria Cross and the entire Canadian contingent was commended for their bravery
