

Tour for humanity - A unique education experience is in North Bay!



The <u>Tour for Humanity</u> bus is in North Bay today, visiting local high schools for the next few days. This educational initiative, presented by the Friends of Simon Wiesenthal Center for Holocaust Studies (FSWC), with the assistance of the North Bay Police Service, is a fully self-contained mobile classroom designed to inspire and empower students to raise their voices and take action against hate to help make the world a better place.

"Seven years ago, I was one of 30 Canadian police officers who had the privilege of attending an FSWC-sponsored workshop at the Museum of Tolerance in Los Angeles. The workshop was designed to provide officers with the necessary tools to identify, confront and deal with issues of hate and segregation in society in all forms," said Inspector Kirk Kelusky, North Bay Police Service. "The Tour for Humanity bus in an extension of the FSWC's programming designed for audiences at the secondary school level and we are pleased to have played a role in bringing this rich education experience to our community."

A variety of issues and topics are explored on the Tour for Humanity bus including racism, prejudice, the Holocaust, universal genocide, real-world heroes, the Canadian residential school system, and the internment of Japanese Canadians during the Second World War. Current issues of cyber bullying and examples of intolerance are also discussed.

Pictured above are PTSD service dog trainer Shai Perlmutter and co-founder of United by Trauma Nicole Taylor, together with PTSD service dog-intraining Keats. The three paid a visit to police headquarters on Wednesday March 16th, much to the delight of staff (like Deputy Scott Tod at left) who got to pet her.

Keats is a female Eastern European German Shepherd who was co-sponsored by the North Bay Police Association and North Bay Police Services Board and named in honour of North Bay Police Service Constable Andrew Keating (1985-2014). She is now 10 months old and is getting close to her full size. She may get a little taller and may fill out a bit more in the coming months, making her a good-sized dog for a person in need of her service who lives in an apartment or small household.

United by Trauma is a volunteer PTSD organization based in York Region and made up of first responders who run a PTSD Service Dog program called "Emie's Journey." Each dog is named in memory of a first responder, a soldier or a medical professional from Ontario and undergoes eight months of specialized training in order to assist in the recovery of a person diagnosed with PTSD. Once Keats is a fully trained PTSD service dog, United by Trauma will select the home where Keats will go. The service dog could be placed in a home of an emergency services staff member from North Bay or elsewhere in the province, subject to the need.
