The Chief noted the correspondence received by the NBPS since the last meeting. The first correspondence was received from an individual thanking the NBPS for the great work and in responding to calls from herself and neighbours. She commended them on the work the Police Service is doing with Project Drifter. The second correspondence was received from an individual outlining the importance of 'words' and what is expected of our police officers and the hopes of our directions as being a more protective safety role. He also commended both the Chief and Deputy Chief.

Communication on Community Safety

Deputy Mayor Tanya Vrebosch joined the meeting. She commended the Police Service on its new Facebook site and how it is handling the difficult environment dealing with the pandemic. She stated that the opioid crisis is affecting North Bay and surrounding communities. She asked if discussions can begin with the community to engage them and give them information on what is presently being done, what the community can do to help in this crisis, and what the Police Service needs. She felt communication between the groups can give a better understanding and engage everyone.

Alarm Presentation – Inspector Warner

Inspector Warner updated the Board with the Service Alarm Policy and Procedures. He stated that Intrusion Alarms are ongoing and systems have evolved and are very intricate and complex. The response time to alarms has changed significantly. 95% of intrusion alarms are false alarms. There is no fee charged for the first false alarm. With the second false alarm at the same location, a notice and fine is given. The Police Service receives a very low payment of fees.

Our practices need to be modernized. False alarms tie up precious resources that could be utilized elsewhere. The Police Service will be looking to revise the Policy and the Board will be provided with an update at the September meeting.

Chief and Deputy Chief Monthly Activity

Both the Chief and Deputy Chief reported their activities throughout the area representing the NBPS for the month of May 2021.

To whom it may concern;

This letter of gratitude is intended for the entire service.

Please allow me to set the scene. It's a beautiful Sunday morning, the sun is shining, the birds are singing, and all is peaceful in our world.

My husband and I have just enjoyed our morning coffee together. Our conversation had begun on the subject of the latest newspaper article in which a municipal city councillor has criticized the latest community plan for not having a solution to end the issues of homelessness and addiction in our community. I took the defensive stance. I don't think that the answer is available yet and I truly believe that the planning is not involving the only people who know the answers: those who have risen up from these circumstances into normal, everyday mundane lives of coffee in the morning and watering the lawn.

We discussed how our Police service men and women have been thrust into the truly unusual role of being the front line social service workers for those suffering from addictions, mental health and homelessness and how that's not fair to them. How, when they closed our Psychiatric facility, mental health was so different. If only they'd kept that facility and converted it into a rehabilitation centre, how different would our streets be? Of course, the drugs weren't so potent then.

My husband and I typically like to solve the world's problems at the start of each new day. Since we also had not found a solution to these problems we decided to get on with our day and do something more productive. My husband went to water the lawn and I went inside to tidy up.

As if to say "Hold my coffee" the Universe thought it would be fun to prove our point as only a few minutes later my husband came in and asked me to call the Police.

Living downtown we get to bear witness to a lot. I like our Police service and I'm grateful that you're here for us when we need you, I just wish we didn't need you so often. I think it might be neat to know what it's like to be oblivious to the reality of what's happening out there.

For the first time I really wasn't sure if I should be asking for the Police or Paramedics. We had a young man who was clearly incredibly stoned, likely fentanyl. Sadly I've seen it before. The Naloxone kits are in the kitchen cupboard next to the potatoes for just such instances. The young man was trying to get into our

neighbour's place but not your typical break in scenario, the guy clearly didn't know where he was and had no idea he was doing anything wrong.

Let me be the first to say, the dispatcher was wonderful and calm. She did not make me feel as though the call was a waste of the service's time, she did a great job of trying to figure out what the need was. She asked excellent probing questions and kept me on the line until she was confident the officers would be there.

The two officers that were dispatched were incredibly professional in the way they addressed the young man, how they evaluated the situation, and in the end kept the young man feeling completely safe as the paramedics arrived and took him away.

I feel awful for having to make these calls. This is not what I believe our Police service should be doing with their valuable time but I am truly grateful you do. Someone has to.

So, thank you. Thank you for showing up, for doing the things that no one else knows what to do with, and for being here for our community.

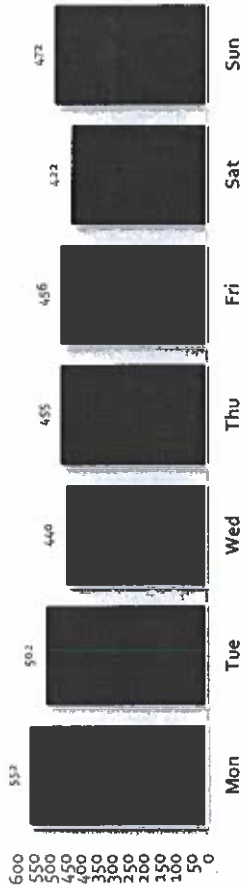

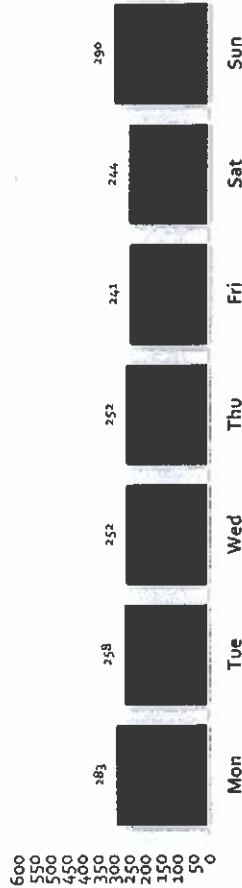

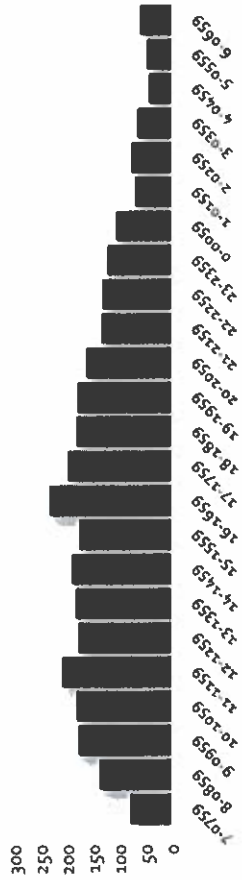
Number of Calls Generated by Day of Week



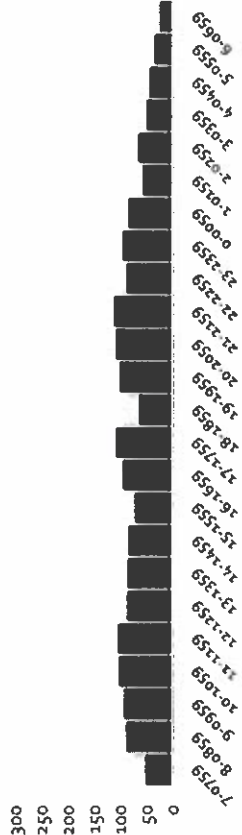
Number of Calls Patrol Dispatched by Day of Week



Number of Calls Generated by Hour of Day



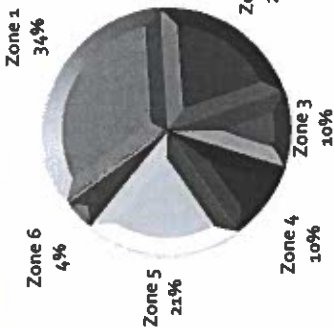
Number of Calls Patrol Dispatched by Hour of Day

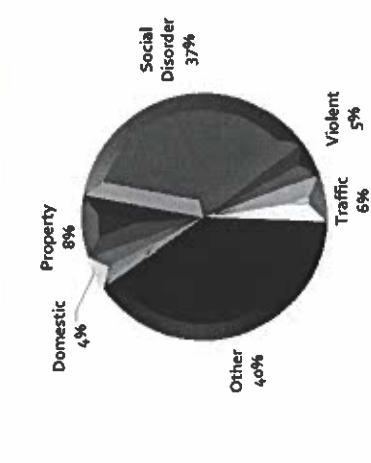
Percent of Calls Patrol Dispatched by Area



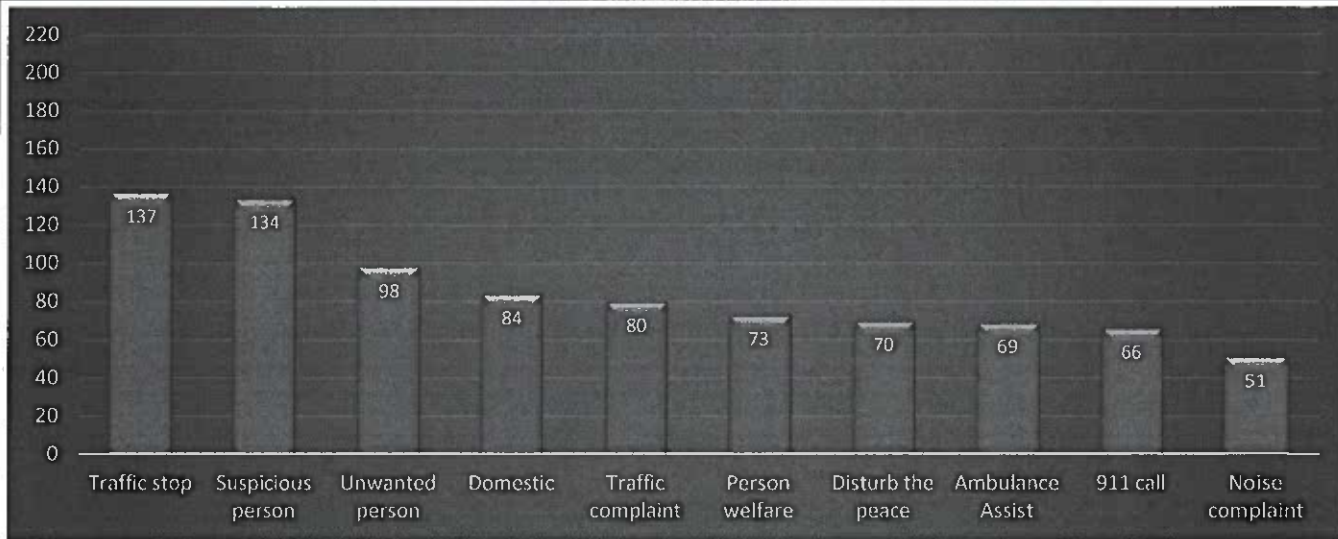
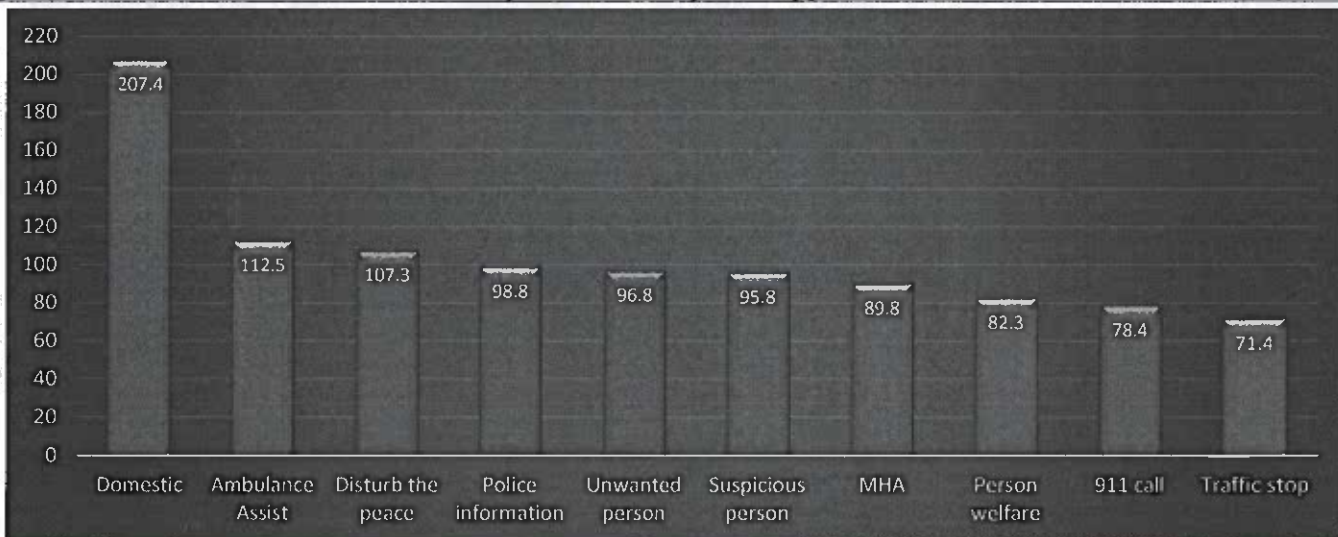
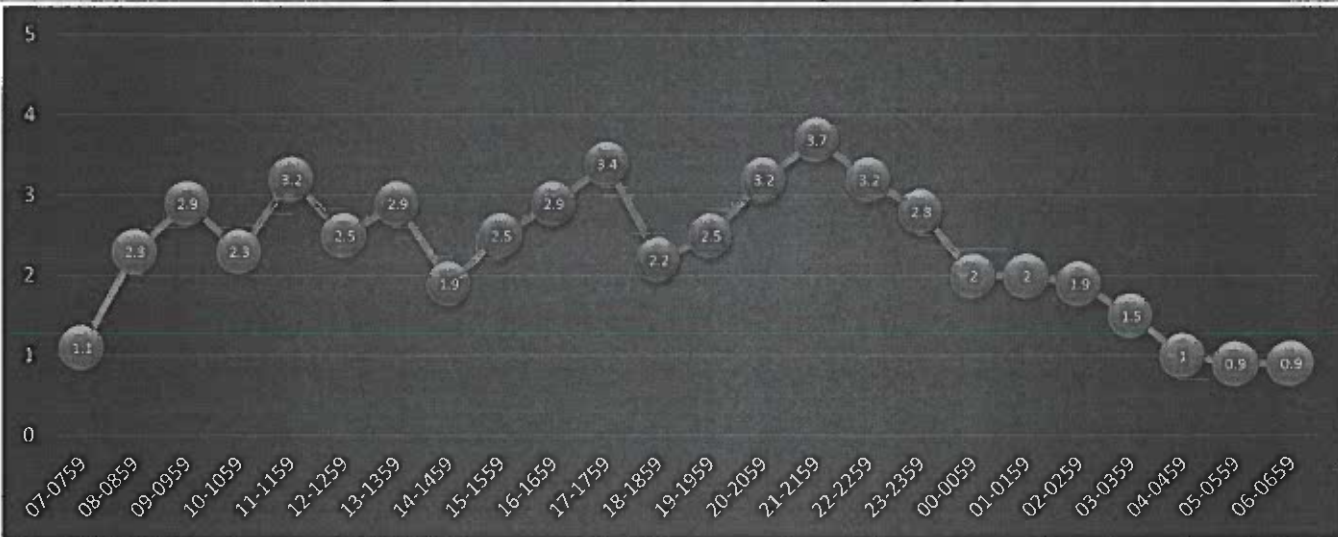

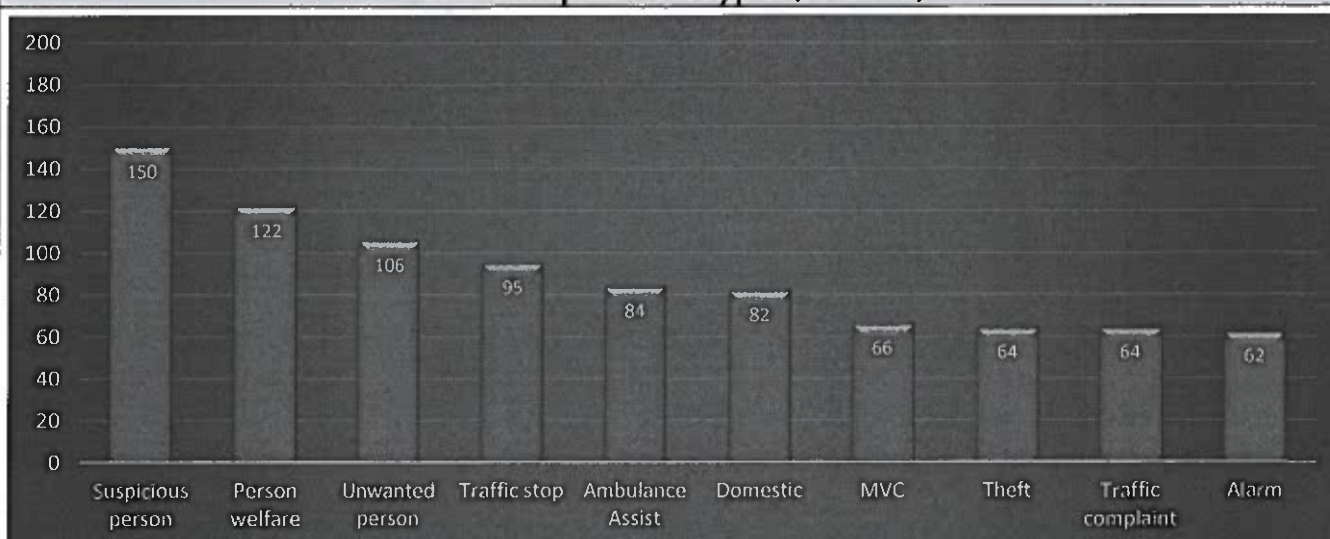

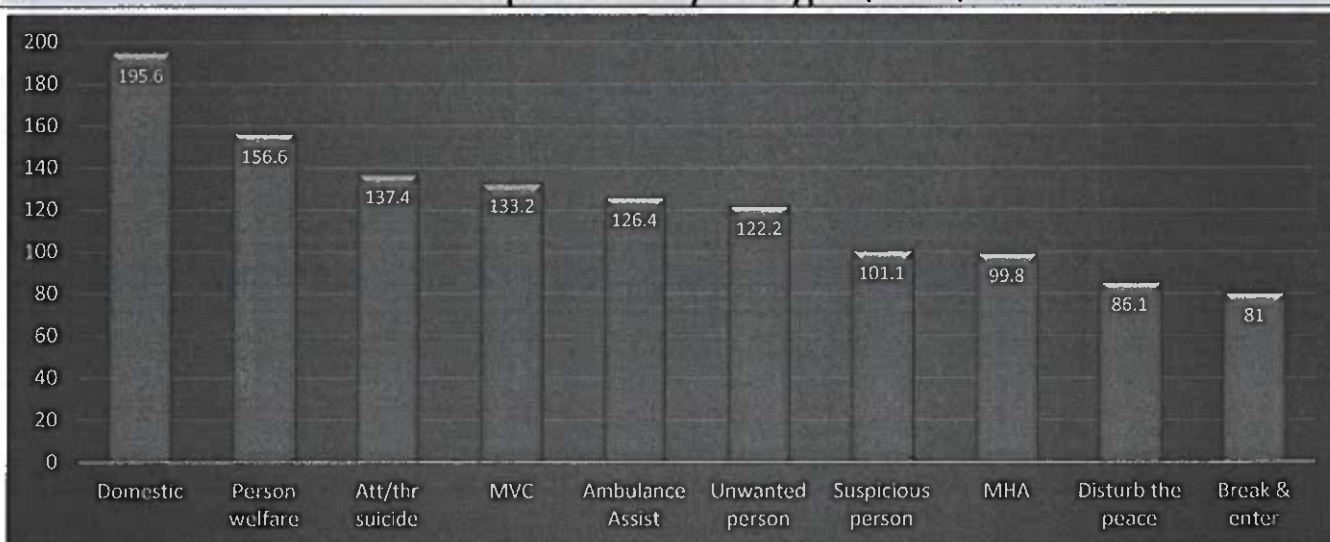

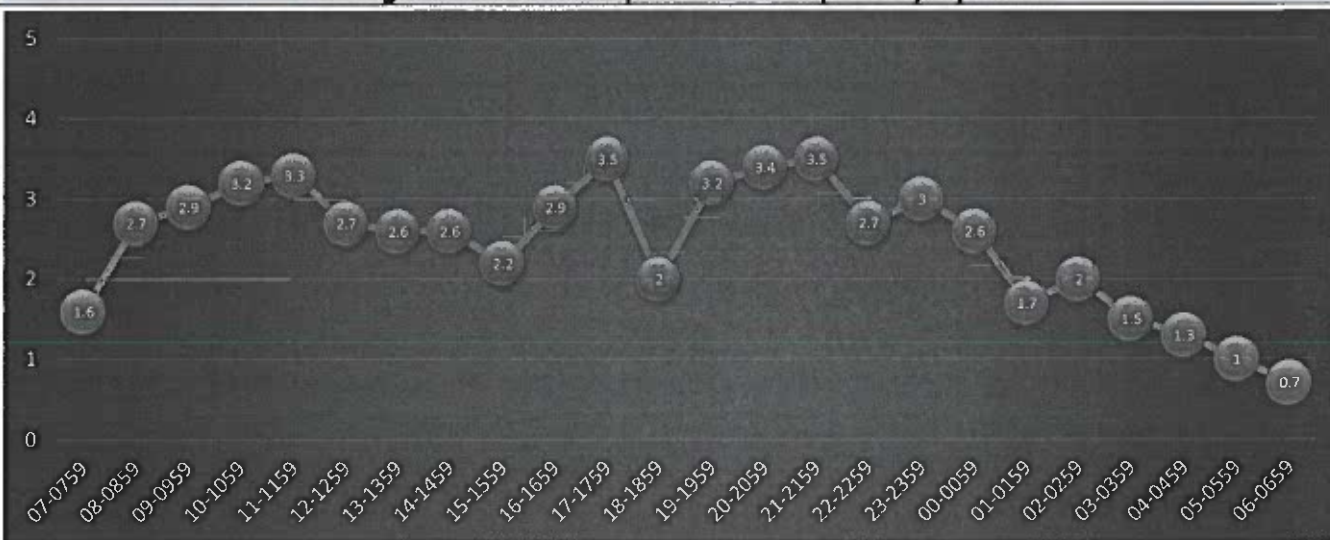
Most Frequent Call Types (Number)

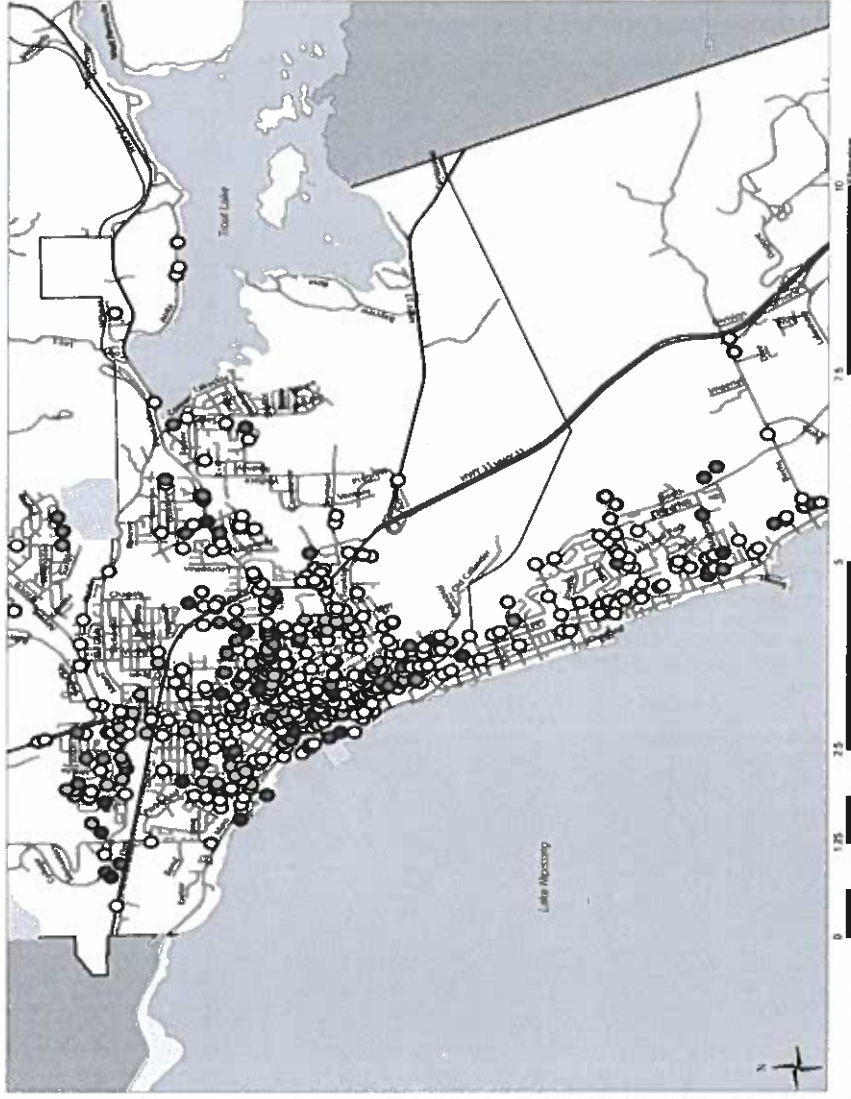

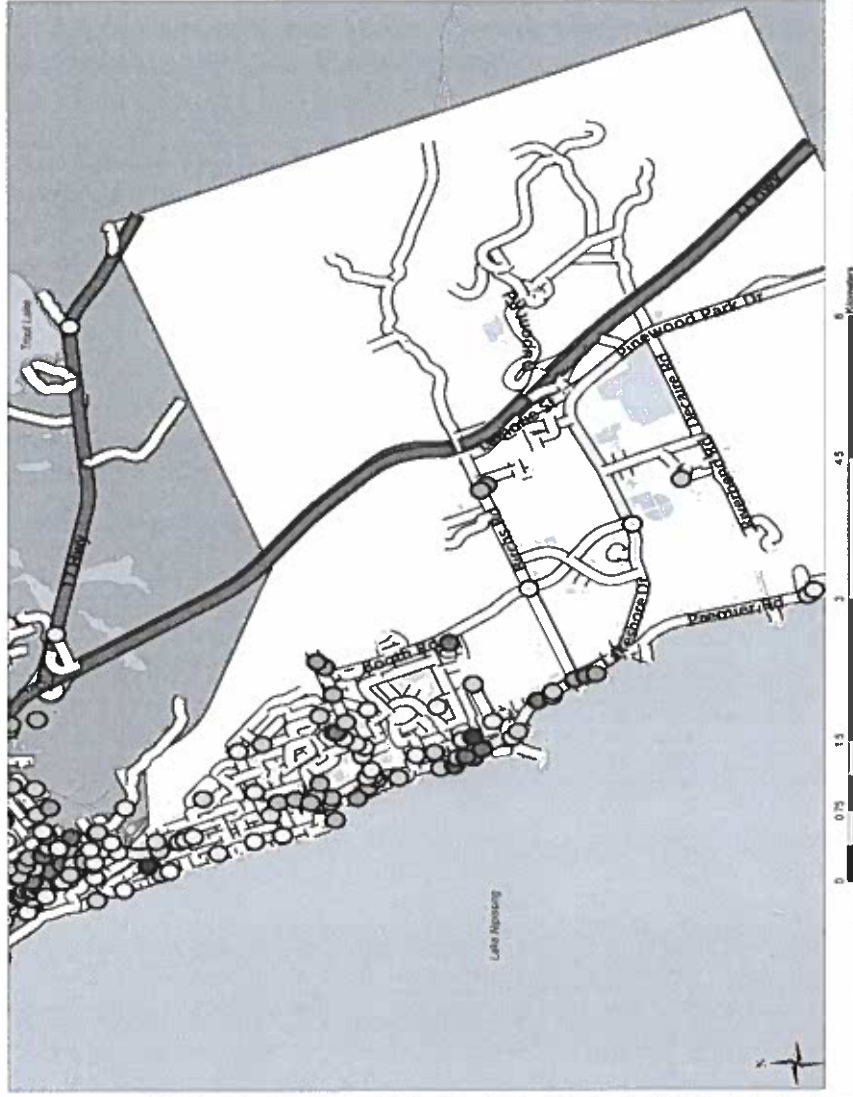
