Taxi Representative Presentation

Mr. John Strang, owner of U Need A Cab, made a presentation to the North Bay Police Service Board regarding the Ride Share program coming to North Bay. He emphasized the need for regulation of this new business. He spoke on the costs of owning/operating a taxi business in North Bay and that allowing another entity to come to North Bay which is not regulated, monitored or safety checked will not only deteriorate the existing taxi businesses but put public health and safety at risk.

Mr. Greg Ducharme, a tax lawyer, representing 5-0 Cab, spoke of the CRA tax laws and the need to regulate the incoming Ride Share business. He implored the Board to deliver the same regulations to "Uride"; i.e. licensing, driver checks, cleanliness, vehicle inspections, etc., to ensure public health and safety is always first.

Ms. Nicole Neal, owner/operator 5-0 Cab, spoke to the Board on the insurance that is required for taxi businesses. She reported that her investigation of Uride's insurance revealed that it had expired in October 2018 and this was a grave concern to her.

The Chair welcomed the guests to speak to the media after the meeting if they wished to discuss it further with them.

Introduction of New Deputy Chief

The Chair introduced the new Deputy Chief, Michael Daze. Acting Chief Scott Tod welcomed Mr. Daze and outlined his attributes and qualifications to the group. There will be a change of command in June and notification will be given once the date has been established.


