Since the last Board meeting there has been an amendment made to an existing MOU with the North Bay District Jail.

Statistical Reports

The Deputy Chief presented the Condensed Monthly Statistical and Revised Reports for September 2013. He spoke about the overall decrease in criminal offenses. The Deputy also spoke about the Hope Project which was formed as a result of 11 drug related deaths with possibly 2 more deaths being attributed to illegal use of the prescription drug fentanyl. As a result of a four week project 26 purchases were made at the street level and 20 individuals were charged with a variety of drug related charges. There were a variety of drugs seized in this undercover operation. Two of the people who were charged have pled guilty and been sentenced.

New Business:

Town Hall Meetings - Business Plan

The Chief shared the report prepared by OraclePoll in relation to the three Town Hall meetings hosted in Callander and North Bay. The meetings were designed to provide input for the development of a new 3 year Business Plan. As part of the Town Hall meetings, the community was educated on the use of CEWs or TASERS and gathered public feedback regarding the expanded use of CEWs.

Discussion at the Board meeting included a suggestion by Sean Lawlor that since 90% of the budget is tied up in salaries, perhaps this is the time to look at better ways to deliver services at less cost. The Chief indicated that the survey results indicate that individuals are happy with the current services and in fact would pay to have more services. They want to at least maintain the status quo.

Many calls for service are not really Police Service issues, ie. Mental Health related or items not being understood by the general public. It is suggested that at the next meeting a motion be brought forward to request that funding be provided to cover some of the programs that have been downloaded on the Police Service that are not Police issues.

Deputy Mayor, Lawlor requested a copy of the survey used by OraclePoll.

2014 Operating Budget

The Chief presented the revised budget which now reflects a 2.2% increase down from the previous 3.3% brought forward from the October meeting. The Chief and staff were congratulated on their hard work to try to keep the budget as low as possible despite restraints created by the Collective Agreements. Remarks by members included cautions that there could be an impact on the level of service if the training and staffing is not maintained. The City wide 1.5% increase was requested as a result of a meeting between the CAO, CFO Mayor and Deputy Mayor, based on the projected increase in the cost of living. A request that there is a need to refocus on the 90% that is tied to salaries was made and the Chief indicated that there have been changes made to this area as well. Staffing has been deferred or not replaced, training has been done via elearning as much as physically possible, equipment replacement has been done frugally and the unpredictability of levels of service required to serve the public all impacts on the budget. Another significant impact on services will be the federally legislated NG911 program. A thank you was also given to the Association for their cooperation in trying to do their part to keep the budget on target. Of special note was the decrease in the number of overtime hours over the past year. A request was made to have a breakdown of the actual cost associated with travel and training, by Sean Lawlor.





NORTH BAY POLICE SERVICE BOARD POLICY BY-LAW 05/2013 PROVISION OF TRAINING TO EXTERNAL AGENCIES

INDEX NUMBER: AI-NBPS-004

DATE: 10 December 2013

PREAMBLE:

- A. The North Bay Police Service is committed to creating and maintaining a positive learning environment in which employees continually develop their knowledge, skills and abilities, to facilitate the highest quality of service to the citizens of our community. Part of our commitment is to share our knowledge base and learning experiences with external agencies.
- B. This By-Law relates to the provision of training by the North Bay Police Service to the personnel of other agencies.
- C. For the purposes of this By-Law, an External Agency shall mean an agency other than the North Bay Police Service and, where the context so indicates, shall mean an agency other than the North Bay Police Service which has been approved by the Chief of Police to receive training from North Bay Police Service personnel.
- D. The North Bay Police Service may provide training to external agencies in such a manner as is approved by the Chief of Police.
- E. Requests from external agencies for training by the North Bay Police Service shall be submitted in writing to the Office of the Chief of Police. The Chief shall review all such requests, and shall have the discretion to approve or refuse any training to an external agency.
- F. An agency approved by the Chief to receive Service training shall pay for related human resources costs of the trainers on a pro-rated basis related to the number of trainees assigned to that training day.
- G. Human resources costs of the trainers shall be calculated and billed in accordance with the applicable rates in the current Collective Agreement Between the North Bay Police s Board and the North Bay Police Association.
- H. In arranging a training schedule, efforts shall be made to accommodate the needs of both the North Bay Police Service and the agency receiving training. However, once a schedule is agreed upon, the external agency shall be required to adhere to it.

- In the event that a member of an external agency is unable to attend training as previously scheduled, the agency may supply a replacement member for training, or shall give reasonable notice to the North Bay Police Service Training Coordinator to ensure that training time is not lost. Subject to the discretion of the Chief, the agency may be billed for the human resources costs of the trainers should reasonable notice not be given.
- J. An external agency approved by the Chief to receive Service training shall be required to pay the costs of all materials used that are specific to the training of that agency's personnel. This may include, but is not limited to, the cost of purchased handout material and, in the case of Use of Service training, shall include, but is not limited to, the actual costs of ammunition, targets, simunition, and cleaning supplies.
- K. Unless otherwise agreed upon, an external agency shall provide for the meals of its personnel during Service training. In the event that meals are provided by the North Bay Police Service during training, the actual cost of the meals shall be borne by the agency.
- L. Except as provided herein, an external agency shall provide for the transportation of its personnel by providing an agency vehicle or by making arrangements with the member to use his/her private vehicle. In the event that there is sufficient room in a Service vehicle that has already been designated for training, providing a waiver of liability as required by the North Bay Police Service is signed, personnel from the external agency may ride at no cost.
- M. In the event that accommodation is required in relation to Service training for the personnel of an external agency, that agency shall be responsible for making the arrangements unless otherwise agreed upon in advance. All accommodation costs incurred by the agency during Service training shall be paid by the agency.
- N. A current list of salary and overtime rates, as well as a current listing of the costs of individual training materials, shall be maintained by the Service.
- O. When an external agency has arranged to receive training from Service personnel, the Chief of Police shall cause the agency to be billed for all associated costs as set out in this By-Law.
- P. This Policy replaces Board By-Law 02/00 dated March 14, 2000.

As the Board is aware we have allocated monies in our 2014 Capital budget request to cover the costs to supplement our existing inventory of CEWs and in the Operating Budget to train our front-line officers in 2014.

Find attached Board By-law #06/2013 that deals with Use of Force. This By-law replaces Board By-law #01/2011 and was drafted using the sample provided by the Ministry. Changes to the Board's previous By-law are found in Article 3.C. (c).

NORTH BAY POLICE SERVICES BOARD USE OF FORCE BY-LAW # 06/2013

INDEX NUMBER: AI-012

DATE: 10 December 2013

PREAMBLE:

WHEREAS the North Bay Police Services Board is responsible for the maintenance of Law and Order in the Municipality, and the members of the Police Service, through the Chief of Police, are subject to the Governance of the Board and shall obey its lawful directions.

THEREFORE, under the authority of the *Police Services Act* 1990, this Board enacts as follows:

- A. The North Bay Police Services Board recognizes that members may be required in the course of their duties to use force to affect arrests, maintain order and protect the public and themselves.
- B. The Board and Police Service are committed to resolving situations by using only as much force as is reasonably necessary, but also recognizes that at times it is necessary for police to use potentially injurious or lethal force.
- C. It is the policy of the North Bay Police Services Board with respect to use of force that:
 - 1. This Board, upon receiving a report on the investigation into an injury or death caused by the discharge of a member's firearm, will:
 - a. Review the report and make further inquiries as necessary; and
 - b. File a copy with the Solicitor General, including any additional inquiries of the Board;
 - This Board, upon being notified that the Chief of Police has discharged a
 firearm in the performance of his/her duty, will cause an investigation into
 the circumstances and file a report on the investigation with the Solicitor
 General.
 - The Chief of Police will:
 - a. Ensure that members do not use a weapon other than a firearm, with the exception of those used on another member in the course of a training exercise in accordance with procedures, unless:
 - i. That type of weapon has been approved for use by the Solicitor General;
 - ii The weapon conforms to technical standards established by

- the Solicitor General: and
- iii The weapon is used in accordance with standards established by the Solicitor General.
- b. Ensure that, at minimum, police officers are:
 - i Issued a handgun that meets the technical specifications set out in the Equipment and Use of Force Regulation;
 - ii Issued oleoresin capsicum aerosol spray;
 - iii Issued a baton; and
 - iv Trained in officer safety, communication, handcuffing and physical control techniques;
- c. Ensure that, all police officers assigned to the Patrol Section receive training in relation to the conducted energy weapons and be authorized to utilize the device on duty.
- d. Ensure that members do not:
 - i Use force on another person unless they have successfully completed a training course on the use of force; and
 - ii Carry a firearm unless, they have successfully completed a training course on the use of firearms, and are competent in the use of the firearm:
- e. Subject to Regulation 926, Equipment and Use of Force, section 14.3 (1), ensure that, at least once every twelve months,
 - Every member of the police force who may be required to use force on other persons takes a training course on the use of force;
 - ii Every member of the police force who is authorized to carry a firearm takes a training course on the use of firearms.
- f. Subject to Regulation 926, of the Equipment and Use of Force section 14.3(2), ensure that:
 - i. If it was not reasonably possible for a member of a police force to take a training course on the use of force or on the use of firearms within the time required by subsection (1), the chief of police may grant the member additional time, not to exceed 60 days, to take the course.
- g. Maintain records of training courses taken and any grants of additional time to take any training courses.
- h. Permit the use of reasonable weapons of opportunity by members, when none of the approved options is available or appropriate to defend them or members of the public;
- i. Establish procedures consistent with the requirements of the Equipment and Use of Force Regulation 926;
- j. Immediately cause an investigation to be made where a member

- unintentionally or intentionally discharges his or her firearm, except on a target range or in the course of weapon maintenance;
- k. Immediately cause an investigation and file a report to this Board where a member, by the discharge of a firearm in the performance of his or her duty, kills or injures another person;
- I. Where the Chief discharges a firearm in the performance of the Chief's duties, promptly report the matter to this Board;
- m. Ensure that written record is maintained on the training courses taken by the members of the police service on the use of force and the use of firearms:
- n. Ensure the reporting of the use of force by members in accordance with the Equipment and Use of Force Regulation 926;
- o. Ensure the ongoing review and evaluation of local use of force procedures, training and reporting;
- p. Provide a copy of the police service's annual use of force study to this Board for review, and ensure the availability of the study to the community; and
- q. Ensure that all members are cognizant of the mandate and authorities of the Special Investigation Unit of the Ministry of the Attorney General and that reports and assistance are provided to members of that organization in accordance with the Police Services Act and Regulations.
- D. It is the policy of the Board that the Service will afford members of the North Bay Police Service, who, as a result of their duties, experience critical incident trauma, immediate, appropriate and adequate aftercare.
- E. North Bay Police Services Board By-Law 01/2011 is hereby repealed.

This By-Law comes into effect on the date of signing.

The North Bay Police Service has a wheelchair in its Exhibit Section which was seized as found property. No persons have sought claim for the property and the North Bay Police Service has no ability to locate the rightful owner.

The property meets the threshold of Section 132 of the Police Services Act in that:

"This Section applies to personal property of all kinds except firearms and money that comes into the possession of the Police Force under either of the following circumstances:

- 1) The property was stolen from its owner or was found abandoned in a public place and the Chief of Police is unable to determine who owns it;
- 2) The property was seized in a manner by the Police Service in lawful execution of his/her duties, all legal proceedings in respect to the property have been completed and there is no Court Order for its disposition and there is no legal requirement apart from this Section that it be retained or disposed of."

Section 132(2) reads:

"The Chief of Police may cause the property be sold and the Board may use the proceeds for any purpose that it considers in the public interest."

It would be my respectful position that a request to the Board be made that the wheelchair should not be sold in public auction but could be used for the public's interest to provide Court security staff with the ability to moved handicapped or injured witnesses or prisoners.
