



Please find attached a copy of a Memorandum of Agreement between Canadore College and the North Bay Police Service. This document lays the foundation of a strategic alliance between the two organizations. This partnership has been formed to enhance opportunities for Anishinabek students, families and communities to support those actively leaning to achieve success and wellbeing.

The North Bay Police Service will collaborate with and learn from the First Peoples' Centre about Indigenous cultures in Canada and the positive effects that the Police Service can provide. Positive effects to the community include increasing their effectiveness and understanding of police responses to the needs of Indigenous persons in North Bay.

Canadore College will provide the North Bay Police Service with knowledge and training to accomplish the immediate goal of developing a better understanding and awareness of Indigenous cultures in Canada. Training will address the principle points of interest identified in the Truth and Reconciliation Report.

The North Bay Police Service will assist Canadore College by offering police expertise and knowledge. The goal is to support students of Canadore College in their pursuit of developing a working perspective of policing in Canada and the associative

knowledge, skills and ability required to become a police service employee.

I wish to thank Shawn Chorney, the VP of enrolment management, Indigenous and student services, Patty Chabbert, the business and Indigenous relations manager and Communications Officer Jessica Charette, from Canadore College, and from the North Bay Police Service, Deputy Scott Tod, Inspector Kirk Kelusky, Sergeant Jody Dehass and Community Safety Coordinator John Shultz for their work in developing this partnership of learning.
