Use of Force – 2016 and 2017 Annual Reports

The Chair, Dennis O'Connor presented 2016-2017 Annual Report on Use of Force. Completed by Cst. Sproule of the Training Section and approved by Insp. Kelusky there were a total of 60 occurrences in 2016 and 85 occurrences in 2017. The occurrences ranged from destroying wounded animals, use of aerosol or impact weapons, deployment/firing of a Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW) and use of empty hand techniques. For the two years, a total of three officers were injured and thirteen subjects injured.

Association Report

Association President Peter Brunette shared that the North Bay Police Association will be the major sponsor of the YMCA Annual Road Hockey Classic. He indicated that there will be 2 teams participating from the North Bay Police Service. Last year \$1000.00 was raised to provide opportunities for youth in the area. The Association will also be participating in the One Kids Place golf fundraiser later in the season.

The Chief thanked Peter for the participation and continued dialogue with the Association at the liaison meetings.

The Chair thanked the Association for their tremendous work with the community to share not only their time but their support for local causes.

Police Cruiser Display

Dear Chief Devine,

My family and I have recently been involved in four unrelated events that have required the assistance of the North Bay Police. I am writing this letter to express our gratitude and thank the officers involved who acted with professionalism and who have helped us immensely during these unfortunate circumstances.

One morning in January, [REDACTED] chased me into my office building and up five flights of stairs. Cst. Al Bedard and Cst. Mark McLeod were on scene within minutes to apprehend him. Cst. Bedard was very empathetic and professional while taking my statement. These officers also spent time with me at the courthouse to ensure I was prepared for the trial while keeping me updated regularly throughout the morning as to why the trial was not proceeding. As in true [REDACTED] fashion, it turned into a circus.

In February, [REDACTED] randomly kicked in my parent's front door on Premier Road and proceeded to assault my elderly father in front of my mother, who is bedridden and fighting brain cancer. Cst. Shank was the lead officer, Cst. Chris Johnson and Cst. Buchholz attended my parent's home to take statements and sort out the chaos. My father was very upset and Cst. Chris Johnson took the time to calm him and was able to make him laugh. I cannot imagine given the circumstances that it was easy to make my father laugh. Cst. Chris Johnson continued to answer our questions weeks after the incident. Cst. Steve Carleton went with my father to the hospital and kept his mind off of the terrible act of violence that he had just experienced. My father said several times since the incident how impressed he was by the service he received and how professional your officers were.

Last week [REDACTED] attempted to break into our home and we caught him on our video surveillance system. After speaking with Sgt. Ken Rice, my husband brought the video to the North Bay Police Station and Cst. Chris Johnson quickly identified the unknown male as [REDACTED] who had already been arrested for breaking into another home that same day. Cst. Chris Johnson immediately took a video statement and laid subsequent charges. Again, great police work and response time. This is the second attempted break and enter on our home in the

last six months and although the first person was not apprehended, Cst. Gerry Martin and Cst. Ross Lingley were at our house within minutes of my husband's phone call. They searched the area which was met with negative results.

Please extend our thanks to these officers. We appreciate their ability to respond to each of our dilemmas in a timely manner, which ultimately resulted in three of the four incidences ending in charges to the culprits. Their dedication and willingness to treat us with respect and care are also much appreciated.

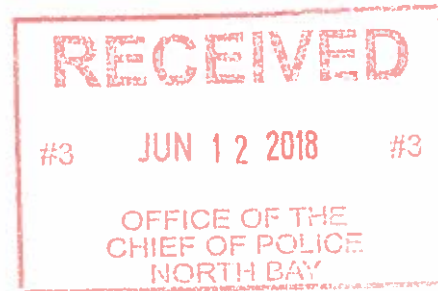

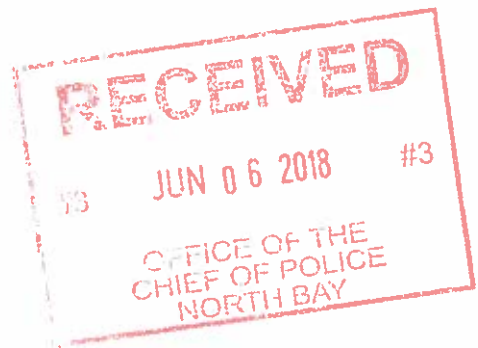
