



Subject: Taxi By-Law Schedule "B" Changes – 2018 Tariff Rates

Recommendation: Information Item

As a result of Resolution #30-2018 that was passed on February 13, 2018 the North Bay Police Services Board Taxi by-Law #20 will be changed in order reflect the increase of the Consumer Price Index for 2017 (1.9%), to be applied to the Drop Rate as well as an increase of 20% which will be applied to both the Roll Rate and Waiting Time Rate.

This process will also be applied in 2019 with respect to the 2018 Consumer Price Index along with an increase to the Drop Rate and Roll Rate which will coincide with the 2019 percentage increase of the minimum wage hike for that year.

CITY OF NORTH BAY

For trips between any two points in the City of North Bay, <u>all rates have HST included</u>

- 1. Trips originating within the city of North Bay for the first 100 meters or part thereof of actual passenger transportation: Drop rate four dollars and seventy cents (\$4.70), and for each additional 40.94 meters of actual passenger transportation travel, a fare of \$0.10, which is equivalent to \$2.44/km.
- 2. (a) For each period of waiting while the vehicle is fully stopped in traffic, there shall be a charged an amount of: thirty-eight dollars and seventy one cents (\$38.71) per hour, prorated per second.
- 3. Baggage handling: In or out of vehicle, No charge.
- 4. Where two or more passengers are carried from a common starting point to more than one destinations, the

fare is to be paid by each passenger shall be as follows:

- (a) The passenger first disembarking shall pay the tariff shown on the meter at that point, subject to any legitimate extras.
- (b) The meter shall then be reset. The passenger next disembarking shall pay the tariff shown on the meter at their destination, subject to any extras, and so on in a like manner until all passengers have been discharged.
- (c) Whenever two or more passengers disembark at the same place, each shall pay his proportionate share of the tariff charge registered at the point where they disembark.

How the new yearly rate is calculated

if CPI= 2.9% then that number becomes 1.029 in the formula HST is always 13% which becomes 1.13 in the formula Calculations

Always take the last years final rate and divide it by 1.13 formula (this gives you the before tax rate)

Then take the before tax rate and multiply by the CPI

ie. For 2012 the CPI was 2.9% or 1.029

Then multiply this new number by the HST again to add it back on

example

To calculate the new rate for 2012

Take the final 2011 rate (\$1.84) and divide by the HST (1.13)

1.84/1.13=1.63

Then take 1.63 and multiply it by the new CPI (2.9% or 1.029)

1.63*1.029=1.678

Then multiply by the HST to add it back on (1.13)

1.678*1.13=1.89 or \$1.89, which is the new rate for 2012

Key in only the % increase of CPI and all other amounts will self calculate.

THIS IS SCHEDULE "B" TO BY LAW NO. 05/2010 Cm OF THE NORTH BAY POLICE SERVICES BOARD

THE FOLLOWING TARIFF OF RATES SHALL BE CHARGED FOR USE OF EVERY TAXI OPERATING UNDER THE WITHIN BY-LAW. ALL RATES HAVE H.S.T. INCLUDED.

- 1. For each trip originating within the City of North Bay there shall be a charge for the first 100 meters or part thereof of actual transportation traveled a fare of \$4.30 and for each 50.66 meters or part thereof of actual passenger transportation travel, a fare of \$0.10, which is equivalent to \$1.97 per km.
- 2. For each period of waiting, while the vehicle is fully stopped there shall be a charged amount of \$31.28 per hour, prorated per second.
- 3. Where two or more passengers are carried from a common starting point to two or more destinations, the fare to be paid by each passenger shall be as follows:
 - (a) The passenger first disembarking shall pay the tariff shown on the taximeter at the point subject to any legitimate extras.
 - (b) The taximeter shall be then reset. The passenger next disembarking shall pay the tariff shown on the meter at their destination, subject to any extras and so on in a like manner until all passengers have been discharged.
 - (c) Whenever two or more passengers disembark at the same place, each shall pay their proportionate share of the charge registered at the point where they disembark.
- 4. Where a passenger enters a taxi, which is already engaged in carrying one or more passengers, the occupants of such taxi shall pay the fare to the point where such subsequent passenger or passengers embark. The taximeter shall then be reset and the person or persons so embarking shall be responsible for the fare to the common destination or to a point where one or more additional passengers embark, whereupon the taximeter shall be reset. This procedure shall be carried on until parties have reached their common destinations.
- 5. A taxicab engaged in carrying a passenger shall not depart from its direct route to its engaged destination without the consent of the passenger being so carried. If the taxi, with such consent, deviates from its route to pick up a passenger otherwise than at the direction of the passenger then engaging the taxicab, the taximeter shall forthwith be turned off and the passenger so carried shall be liable to pay their fare only up to that point.
- 6. The per km transportation rates which are set out in paragraph 1 shall be increased each year by a percentage increase equal to the rate of inflation as set out in the Consumer Price Index as published by Statistics Canada on December 31
- 7. The increase as indicated in paragraph 6 shall take effect on February 1 of the following year.
- 8. Taxi owners shall have 15 business days from February 1 to have their taxi meter inspected and re-sealed to comply with the increase in rates as set out in paragraph 6 in order to conform with the increase in rates and the date of effectiveness as set out in paragraphs 6 and 7.

NORTH BAY POLICE SERVICES BOARD COMMENDATION

DETECTIVE CONSTABLE JASON LONG

D/Cst. Long has been a member of the North Bay Police Service since August 2001 and has been a member of the Criminal Investigation Section for the past eight (8) years. He is currently a fully-trained member of the Provincial Strategy which is a multi-disciplinary approach to investigating child exploitation cases and internet crimes against children.

D/Cst. Long received extensive training in: ICE (Internet Child Exploitation); Advanced ICE (U/C-covert techniques on the computer to communicate with suspects) and Peer to Peer (Pro-Active Investigations into subjects who search for and download child Pornography). Upon completing this specialized training in 2015, D/Cst. Long has investigated several high profile cases related to Internet Child Exploitation offences, many of which were the subject of local and national media reports.

Armed with ever-advancing technology and sophisticated investigative techniques, highly trained teams from 26 police agencies across Ontario work cooperatively to eradicate internet child exploitation. The strategy was created in 2006 in response to the need for a coordinated, province-wide approach to combatting online crimes against children. The Provincial Strategy averages close to 3,000 new investigations per year and lays approximately 1,100 charges against 300+ people each and every year.

Locally, D/Cst. Long has investigated 65 child exploitation related incidents (Child Pornography, Luring and Non-Consensual Distribution of Intimate Images etc.) which have resulted in 74 total charges being laid against 29 people over the past three years. D/Cst. Long's expertise has had far reaching implications. For example, as a result of an investigation that originated in New Zealand involving a North Bay resident, D/Cst. Long liaised with members from the Toronto Police Service and U.S. Homeland Security in Boston to apprehend the offender.

D/Cst. Long is now transitioning out of the Provincial Strategy and is mentoring another officer to take over as the NBPS ICE Investigator. D/Cst. Long is an asset to the service and the community. His dedication and professionalism in this difficult area of expertise is commendable.

ONLINE LURING



The Internet and other technology allow teens to quickly connect and communicate with friends, search topics they would otherwise be too embarrassed to discuss with others and experiment with intimacy. While these are all healthy adolescent behaviours, technology does present risks to teens, including that of being lured online.

Online luring is a situation where one person (typically an adult but not always) communicates with a young person through technology (like texting, IM, SMS, etc.) to make it easier to commit a specific sexual offence against that young person. An example of a communication that could qualify as online luring is if the person asks, hints at or tries to convince a young person to create or send naked or semi-naked sexual pictures or videos.

Adults with harmful intentions can use the Internet to prepare teens for future sexual contact. They do this by sending an adolescent sexually explicit material, misrepresenting themselves or attempting to establish a personal relationship with the teen to extort information and/or meet up with them in person.

Live streaming, for example, may be introduced for fun and then progress to persistent requests from the adult for nude or partially nude pictures/videos. Some offenders, under the guise of a romantic relationship, ask a teen to take a sexual picture and send it online. This content may later be used to blackmail or extort the teen (e.g., "If you don't send me more photos, I will send the ones I have to all your friends/family").

Why teens are vulnerable

Teens are vulnerable to being lured or otherwise victimized online as their behaviour is less inhibited when they use technology. They are not developmentally ready to handle the complex situations that can arise online; conversations that may initially appear friendly can quickly become sexual or coercive in nature. Understandably, youth may feel intrigued and flattered by these conversations and continue to engage, believing it to be harmless. In other instances, the young person may believe that they are in a real romantic relationship with the online individual and may wish to meet in person.

It's very important to have conversations with teens about the risks associated with using technology to experiment sexually. Teens will often comply with online threats in an effort to manage the situation on their own since it is often very difficult for them to seek adult assistance if they're embarrassed and/or scared. The desire to meet the individual in person could place the teen in a dangerous situation.



Talking to youth about online luring

- Use real-life examples as your child is less likely to become defensive when a scenario is not about them personally. At the same time, it opens the door for your child to share a similar situation or concern with regard to themselves or a peer.
- Encourage open communication and be conscious of your adolescent's sensitivity to social judgment and societal
 and peer pressures, as they may be hesitant to share their personal experiences with you.
- Explain that there is no need or urgency to respond to messages of any kind. Teach them not to respond to
 messages that make them feel uncomfortable and to tell a safe adult about it.
- Discuss how sharing personal issues or situations online with the wrong person could leave someone open to manipulation and mistreatment.
- Talk about how to get out of conversations and/or online relationships when they feel uncomfortable. Discuss
 direct messaging (e.g., "I don't want to" followed by deleting or blocking the person) and indirect messaging such
 as making up excuses (e.g., "My mom checks my computer randomly and would ground me").
- Explain that adults should never attempt to become "friends" with or give sexual attention to teenagers. Explain that this is boundary-breaking behaviour and it demonstrates the adult is using poor judgment, making it unsafe to interact with them.
- Discuss that it is illegal to threaten someone online or offline. Explain that threats are often used in an attempt to control youth and get them to comply with unsafe demands. If someone threatens them, they should NOT respond and should tell a safe adult.
