Please find attached the 2016 and 2017 Use of Force Annual Reports as completed by Cst. Sproule of our Training Section and approved by Inspector Kelusky. In 2016, the total number of occurrences that required the submission of a Use of Force Report was sixty (60). Four (4) of these occurrences were in relation to destroying a wounded animal. Two (2) reports involved the use of aerosol or impact weapons, eight (8) involve the deployment/firing of a Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW) and thirteen (13) involve the use of empty hand techniques. One (1) Officer received injuries while two (2) subjects were injured.

In 2017, the total number of occurrences that required the submission of a Use of Force Report was eighty-five (85). Seven (7) of these occurrences were in relation to destroying a wounded animal. Three (3) reports involved the use of aerosol or impact weapons, fourteen (14) involve the deployment/firing of a Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW) and ten (10) involve the use of empty hand techniques. Two (2) Officers received injuries while eleven (11) subjects were injured.

A. Overview and Mandate

The proper completion and analysis of the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services "Use of Force Report" or more commonly identified as a "Form 1" assists police services in instituting or adapting training to best prepare its officers and ultimately to serve their communities.

The reports contain information that assists management in addressing scheduling and equipment issues; for example: times of the week when it would be beneficial to have more officers working or whether a certain use of force option (weapon) is or isn't effective. The *Police Services Act* and North Bay Police Standard Operating Procedures dictate when a police officer is to submit a Use of Force Report.

Mandatory police officer submission for a Use of Force Report occurs in the following situations:

- a. Draws a handgun in the presence of a member of the public, excluding a member of the Service, while on duty;
- b. Points a firearm at a person;
- c. Discharges a firearm;
- Uses a weapon other than a firearm on another person;
- e. Uses a conducted energy weapon, in the probe mode, drive stun mode or demonstrative mode on another person; and/or
- f. Uses physical force on another person that results in an injury requiring medical attention

In addition to ensuring that the training received by the members of the North Bay Police Service meet Ministry Standards, the Service's Training Unit conducts an analysis of all Use of Force Reports submitted to identify any trends that may require further investigation.

B. Executive Summary

The terms "occurrence" and "report" will be referred to throughout this report. For clarification, an "occurrence" is the actual call for service that resulted in officers having attended a scene. "Report" shall refer to the approved Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services "Use of Force Report" or "Form 1".

It is important to distinguish between the number of occurrences and the number of reports generated by the occurrences because the figures may be misleading. For each reportable Use of Force occurrence (criteria listed above) a Use of Force Report (Form 1) must be submitted. However in some instances several officers may have had to utilize force in the same occurrence, which requires a separate

or additional report(s) to be generated. For the purpose of this report the number of occurrences is perhaps the more important figure.

Officers of the Service responded to a variety of calls in 2016 that required the Use of Force on members of the public. Robberies, domestic disputes, attempted suicides, other *Mental Health Act* apprehensions, high risk search warrant executions, and licensed establishment disturbances are just a few examples.

In 2016 the total number of occurrences that required the submission of a Use of Force Report was 60. This is a decrease of 13 from 2015's total of 73. 4 of these occurrences were in relation to officers utilizing a firearm to euthanize wounded animals leaving 56 occurrences that involved the use of force on a member of the public that required a Use of Force Report (Form 1).

The following chart depicts the number of occurrences when Use of Force was used in 2016. Please note how the number of reports is significantly higher than the occurrences. This was due to the fact in some instances two or more officers had to submit a Use of Force report for the same occurrence.

A. Overview and Mandate

The proper completion and analysis of the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services "Use of Force Report" or more commonly identified as a "Form 1" assists police services in instituting or adapting training to best prepare its officers and ultimately to serve their communities.

The reports contain information that assists management in addressing scheduling and equipment issues; for example: times of the week when it would be beneficial to have more officers working or whether a certain use of force option (weapon) is or isn't effective. The *Police Services Act* and North Bay Police Standard Operating Procedures dictate when a police officer is to submit a Use of Force Report.

Mandatory police officer submission for a Use of Force Report occurs in the following situations:

- a. Draws a handgun in the presence of a member of the public, excluding a member of the Service, while on duty;
- b. Points a firearm at a person;
- c. Discharges a firearm;
- d. Uses a weapon other than a firearm on another person;
- e. Uses a conducted energy weapon, in the probe mode, drive stun mode or demonstrative mode on another person; and/or
- f. Uses physical force on another person that results in an injury requiring medical attention

In addition to ensuring that the training received by the members of the North Bay Police Service meet Ministry Standards, the Service's Training Unit conducts an analysis of all Use of Force Reports submitted to identify any trends that may require further investigation.

B. Executive Summary

Officers of the Service responded to a variety of calls in 2017 that required the Use of Force on members of the public. Robberies, domestic disputes, attempted suicides, other *Mental Health Act* apprehensions, high risk search warrant executions, and licensed establishment disturbances are just a few examples.

In 2017 the total number of occurrences that required the submission of a Use of Force Report was 85. This is an increase of 25 from 2016's total of 60. 7 of these occurrences were in relation to officers utilizing a firearm to euthanize wounded animals leaving 78 occurrences that involved the use of force on a member of the public that required a Use of Force Report (Form 1).

The following chart depicts the number of occurrences when Use of Force was used in 2017.
